1. **"The Development of Lace"** A short history of lace from the beginning of the 15th century to the early 20th century. Typescript and 50 slides, 40-50 minutes.
2. **"19th Century Handmade Lace"** - Details of the different types of handmade laces: needle, bobbin, etc. Typescript and 40 slides, 40 minutes.
3. **"19th Century Machine-made Lace"** - History of the development of lace machines, and the influence of machine-spun cotton thread upon handmade lace. Typescript and 40 slides, 40 minutes.
4. **"The History of Needlelace"** - The evolution of needlelace from embroidery in the early 16th century to the early 20th century. Typescript and 39 slides.
5. **"Lace in Fashion"** - The use of lace in fashion, from the narrow bands of edgings in the early 16th century through the grand ages of the 17th and 18th centuries. Typescript and 44 slides, 40-50 minutes. Also available , with a French typescript.
6. **"A Thrill of Fans"** - Brief history of antique fans and different laces suitable for use on fan sticks. Typescript and 25 slides, 30-35 minutes.
